Giovanni Ziccardi is a **jurist**. A **law graduate**, he is a **lawyer**. He is not, therefore, a pure computer scientist, nor a programmer, nor does he have advanced technological or hacking skills. Since his high school, university and Ph.D. years, however, he has always sought to analyze the impact of information technology and new technologies on Law and Society in depth, and in all its aspects, with an **interdisciplinary approach and “contamination” between sciences**, also approaching the world of programming, of an advanced use of technologies by the jurist (and the “professional”) and collaborating with computer scientists and technicians.

Over the years, he has thus dealt with **Legal Informatics** in the broader sense, computer law and new technologies, cybercrime, digital investigations, smart contracts, blockchain, metaverse, **open access and open science**, open code, legal tech and cryptography and artificial intelligence. Over the years, he has studied the topics of freedom of expression on the web, **digital dissidence**, electronic resistance, and the use of technologies for freedom and the protection of human rights, analyzing the concept of digital freedoms and the importance of freedom and human rights in cyberspace. Of particular interest to him are the topics of computer and **digital investigations**, computer and digital forensics and law enforcement hacking tools, anti-forensics and anonymity on the net.

He has studied **ethics**, netiquette and deontology in the computer and telematic age, together with computer ethics and the ethical use of artificial intelligence. Over the years, he has devoted specific attention to the issues of privacy, data protection, information security and cybersecurity. He is interested in the topics of cybercrimes, cyberstalking, cyberbullying, online grooming and sexting, revenge porn and hate between minors.

In recent years, he has conducted research in the areas of **freedom of thought and online hate speech**, law in the world of music (and new technologies), open source and copyright in the digital age, with a focus on Creative Commons licences and their evolution in relation to copyright. From a more practical, and less theoretical, point of view, he studies information technology for the legal professional and the use of word processing systems in the drafting of acts, smart working and the dematerialization process of the profession, the management of legal information on big databases and on the web, organization and research methods, **predictive theories** and the best ways of interfacing with the user. All that is needed, in short, for a **modern, hybrid and digitalized jurist** to perform his work as efficiently as possible. He is also fascinated by the topics of the relationship between cryptography and law, **hacking** and the search for anonymity, protection and identity theft.

His latest lines of research, and his most recent studies, concern the relationship between social networks and the legal profession, privacy and security in the jurist's online presence, the secure practice of law, deontology and netiquette on social networks, **death, mourning and their relationship with technology** (immortality, oblivion and digital inheritance) and **online propaganda** (conditioning consensus and democratic balances, electronic democracy and online voting, politics and technology, managing fake news). Over the next few years, he and his research team will continue to be interested in the topics of **artificial intelligence** applied to law and society, European, US and Chinese regulation with regard to data protection and surveillance and control, GDPR and its update/integration with other measures, cybercrimes and their evolution (especially in the post-pandemic period), **information warfare** and all those topics that will become of crucial importance in the digital society of the years to come. Recently (starting in 2022/2023), Giovanni Ziccardi has also initiated targeted research lines and European projects on the topics of **online antisemitism**, deepfake, profiling, fake news and **conspiracy theories** in middle-aged people (45-65), the relationship between technology and art, the use of **podcasts** as a tool for legal education and outreach, the use of artificial intelligence by teachers (also) to make students aware of how to detect fake news, the understanding of the GDPR even for non-lawyers, **sanctions** imposed by the European supervisor authorities, and the **narration** of important trials.
